**Subject:** (i) Effective identification of demographic similar entries and deletion of duplicate / multiple registrations in tune with section 17,18 and 62 of Representation of People Acts, while Protecting the Right of Citizens of the Country to hold "Single vote" at their choice of place.

(ii) Kindly utilize the SIR-2026 effectively to also identify the double and duplicate votes across all the States comparing with State of Telangana and vice versa as such practice is strictly prohibited by Sections 17,18 and 62 of RP ACT – Reg.

**Respected Sir,**

1. The Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS), a recognised political party in the State of Telangana, respectfully submits this representation in continuation of the representations referred to above. Through the aforesaid representations, the BRS has already brought to the notice of the Hon'ble Election Commission several issues requiring immediate attention for ensuring a clean, transparent, accurate and legally sustainable electoral roll. The present representation is primarily intended to place before the Hon'ble Election Commission the issue of suspected duplicate and multiple voter registrations identified during the ongoing Special Intensive Revision (SIR)-2026, together with certain other connected issues requiring immediate consideration.

**2.** The Bharat Rashtra Samithi reiterates its complete support for and lawful participation in the Special Intensive Revision (SIR)-2026, which is being undertaken after nearly twenty-four years since the last Special Intensive Revision conducted in the year 2002. The object of this historic exercise is to prepare a pure, accurate and error-free electoral roll, which forms the very foundation of free, fair, democratic and lawful elections. The identification and deletion of duplicate, multiple, shifted, deceased and otherwise ineligible electoral entries constitute the most significant component of this exercise and are indispensable for upholding the democratic principle of "**One Citizen – One Vote.**" Unless duplicate and multiple voter registrations are comprehensively identified and removed, the principal object of the Special Intensive Revision cannot be fully achieved, and the purity, credibility and legality of the electoral rolls would continue to remain affected. At the same time, while identifying duplicate and otherwise ineligible entries, utmost care and caution must be exercised to ensure that no genuine elector is wrongly deleted from the electoral roll, thereby safeguarding the valuable constitutional and statutory right of every eligible citizen to vote.

**3.** With the sole objective of assisting the Election Commission in this historic exercise, the Bharat Rashtra Samithi has constituted a dedicated network of approximately **35,000 Booth Level Agents (BLAs)** throughout the State of Telangana. These Booth Level Agents are actively working in close coordination with the Booth Level Officers (BLOs), Village Revenue Officers (VROs), Mandal Revenue Officers (MROs) and other concerned officials in identifying, verifying and reporting suspected duplicate and multiple voter registrations solely in the interest of strengthening the purity, transparency, credibility and integrity of the electoral rolls.

**4.** During the course of the ongoing Special Intensive Revision, the Bharat Rashtra Samithi, while assisting the statutory authorities in the verification process, have identified a substantial number of suspected duplicate and multiple voter registrations spread across all the **119 Assembly Constituencies** in the State of Telangana. The preliminary analysis clearly indicates that the issue is not confined to a few isolated constituencies but exists across the entire State, thereby requiring a comprehensive, scientific and technology-assisted verification process by the Hon'ble Election Commission. The magnitude of the issue, as

revealed during the preliminary analysis, demonstrates that systematic verification is essential to achieve the objectives of the Special Intensive Revision.

**5.** During the course of this exercise, the Bharat Rashtra Samithi has classified the suspected duplicate and multiple voter registrations into the following four categories for the purpose of facilitating systematic verification by the Election Commission:

**Category-I:** Electors having more than one electoral entry within the same Assembly Constituency.

**Category-II:** Electors having more than one electoral entry within the same Parliamentary Constituency.

**Category-III:** Electors having multiple electoral entries in different Assembly Constituencies within the State of Telangana.

**Category-IV:** Electors possessing one electoral registration in the State of Telangana and another electoral registration in one or more neighbouring States.

**6.** The above issue assumes even greater significance because Telangana is a relatively new State formed in the year 2014 and shares its borders with the States of Andhra Pradesh, Maharashtra, Karnataka and Chhattisgarh. Owing to migration, bifurcation-related factors and continuous inter-State movement of citizens, the possibility of duplicate and multiple electoral registrations across neighbouring States cannot be ruled out. Identification and deletion of such inter-State duplicate registrations therefore constitutes one of the most crucial components of the Special Intensive Revision. Failure to identify and eliminate such duplicate registrations would seriously compromise the purity, credibility and legality of the electoral rolls. A comprehensive, scientific and technologically robust verification mechanism is therefore indispensable to identify and eliminate instances where a single individual has secured multiple electoral registrations. Such multiple registrations are contrary to law and strike at the very foundation of the democratic principle of "**One Citizen – One Vote.**"

**7.** Based upon a detailed analysis of electoral data available in the public domain through the official websites of the concerned public authorities, the Bharat Rashtra Samithi has identified a substantial number of suspected duplicate and multiple voter registrations falling

under Categories I, II, III and IV across all the **119 Assembly Constituencies** in the State of Telangana. The analysis reveals an average of approximately **16,243 suspected duplicate entries per Assembly Constituency**, with the highest being **53,695** and the lowest being **2,464**. These figures represent only suspected duplicate and multiple voter registrations requiring verification through the statutory procedure prescribed by the Election Commission before any deletion is affected.

**DETAILS OF THE SUSPECTED DUPLICATE/MULTIPLE VOTER REGISTRATIONS OF FEW ASSEMBLY CONSTITUENCIES IN TELANGANA AS PER OUR ANALYSIS:**

**NOTE: It is respectfully submitted that suspected duplicate and multiple voter registrations have been identified across all the 119 Assembly Constituencies in the State of Telangana. For the sake of brevity and ready reference, only a few illustrative Assembly Constituencies have been presented in the above table. The enclosed data is merely representative in nature and is intended only to demonstrate the magnitude of the issue. The actual instances identified by the Bharat Rashtra Samithi extend across all the Assembly Constituencies in the State and require verification strictly in accordance with the procedure prescribed under law. These instances are therefore only illustrative and not exhaustive.**

**8.** The Bharat Rashtra Samithi has independently identified several instances of suspected duplicate and multiple voter registrations. A few illustrative cases falling under Categories I, II and III are enclosed as **Annexures-1, 2 and 3** to this representation for the kind consideration of the Hon'ble Election Commission. These illustrative cases are being furnished only to facilitate verification by the Commission and to demonstrate the nature and extent of the issue identified during the course of the ongoing Special Intensive Revision

**9.** The Bharat Rashtra Samithi respectfully requests the Hon'ble Election Commission to **utilise all available scientific and technological tools, including Aadhaar-enabled verification wherever legally permissible, de-duplication software, Artificial Intelligence-assisted matching, facial recognition-assisted verification, GIS-based verification and other advanced technological solutions,** in addition to field verification through the statutory machinery. Adoption of such a comprehensive verification mechanism would enable accurate identification and elimination of duplicate and multiple voter registrations while simultaneously ensuring that no genuine elector is wrongly deleted from the electoral roll. Such an integrated approach would substantially strengthen the accuracy, purity, transparency and credibility of the electoral rolls and reinforce public confidence in the electoral process.

**10.** It is imperative for us to bring to your notice the special situation prevailing in the State of Telangana, as it was earlier part of undivided Andhra Pradesh. During that period, several lakhs of voters have maintained votes at their respective native places in Andhra and Rayalaseema areas of the erstwhile State, while holding a vote in Hyderabad and its adjoining districts. The political parties of contemporary time have also encouraged that practice, advertently or inadvertently. But such duplicate/double votes are still continuing. Our specific request to the Hon'ble Election Commission in this regard is that these double and duplicate votes are to be first identified and thereafter an opportunity be given to the voters to choose one vote of their choice of one place to protect their vote, in tune with the law which says ONE CITIZEN - ONE VOTE. It is not out of the place to submit that Sections 17, 18 and 62 of the Representation of the People Act, 1950, are very clear in prohibiting citizens from holding more than one vote. Any practice contrary to the above legal position is not only illegal but also an offence with significant penal consequences. We submit that there cannot be any other opportunity for our Nation or for the Election

Commission, more than the SIR-2026, to implement the above stated law to purify the Electoral Rolls by deleting these fraudulent duplicate and double votes. As such we humbly request Hon'ble Commission to take up the issue with full force in accordance with the law. If such duplicate and multiple voter registrations continue to exist, they are contrary to the democratic principle of "One Citizen – One Vote" and have the potential to adversely affect the purity, credibility and legality of the electoral rolls as well as the legitimate outcome of elections. The ongoing Special Intensive Revision therefore provides an appropriate opportunity for the Hon'ble Election Commission to undertake a comprehensive verification of such inter-State duplicate voter registrations and eventually to remove the duplicate votes.

**11.** While the elimination of duplicate and multiple voter registrations is absolutely essential for maintaining the purity of the electoral rolls, equal importance must be attached to protecting the voting rights of every genuine elector. Any erroneous deletion of a genuine voter would result in grave injustice by unlawfully depriving such citizen of his or her valuable constitutional and statutory right to vote, which forms the very essence of democratic process of governance. The objective of the Special Intensive Revision is to identify and eliminate duplicate, multiple and otherwise ineligible registrations, and not to curtail or deny the franchise of genuine electors. Therefore, every suspected duplicate or multiple voter registration must be subjected to strict verification in accordance with law, and no deletion should be affected unless the competent authority is fully satisfied, on the basis of due enquiry and verification, that the entry is in fact duplicate, multiple or otherwise liable to be removed under the provisions of law.

**12.** It is submitted that we have given representations on 23.06.2026, 24.06.2026 and 06.07.2026 and the contents of this representation may be treated as part and parcel of the present representation.

**13.** The people of Telangana, like every citizen of this country, regard their vote as one of their most valuable democratic rights. Any inadvertent deletion of the name of a genuine elector from the electoral roll would not only cause irreparable prejudice to such individual but would also undermine public confidence in the electoral process and defeat the very purpose for which the Special Intensive Revision has been initiated. At the same time, failure to identify and remove duplicate and multiple voter registrations would equally compromise the integrity and credibility of the electoral rolls. The success of the Special Intensive Revision therefore depends upon maintaining a careful balance between

the effective elimination of duplicate and ineligible entries and the complete protection of the voting rights of every genuine elector.

**In view of the above, it is most respectfully prayed that the Hon'ble Election Commission may be pleased to:**

a. Verify and delete duplicate and multiple voter registrations strictly in accordance with law after conducting due verification, while also taking into consideration the analysis, data and material furnished by the Bharat Rashtra Samithi.

b. Utilise all available **scientific and technological tools, including Aadhaar-enabled verification wherever legally permissible, de-duplication software, Artificial Intelligence-assisted matching, facial recognition-assisted verification, GIS-based verification and other advanced technological solutions** together with field verification through the statutory machinery, for effective identification and elimination of duplicate and multiple voter registrations.

c. Ensure that no genuine elector is deprived of his or her valuable constitutional and statutory right to vote on account of any procedural deficiency, inadvertent error, incomplete verification or mistaken identity.

d. Continue to conduct the Special Intensive Revision in a transparent, fair, participative, scientific and legally sustainable manner so as to ensure preparation of a pure, accurate, error-free and credible electoral roll.

The Bharat Rashtra Samithi once again assures the Hon'ble Election Commission of India of its fullest cooperation in the successful implementation of the Special Intensive Revision (SIR)-2026 and remains committed to assisting the Commission in preserving the purity, transparency, credibility and integrity of the electoral rolls,

thereby strengthening the democratic electoral process in the State of  
Telangana and in the country.
